STATEMENT OF WCCW

Four years have passed since the U.S. Congress unanimously adopted House Resolution 121 demanding the Japanese Government's official apology for human rights violation to 200,000 girls and women forced into sexual slavery by the Japanese military during the Second World War. The WCCW must emphasize the Japanese Government's total obliviousness to and denial of this historical fact and continued silence and lack of response to the Resolution of the U.S. Congress. The WCCW reiterates its demand to the Japanese Government to come to grips with this grave human rights violation and to respond to the unanimous Resolution of the American people.

RESOLUTION

Noting the total lack of sincere and truthful recognition of the Comfort Women issue by the Japanese Government, and unless and until the Japanese Government officially recognizes this flagrant wrong, apologizes to the surviving Comfort Women, and makes official reparations, we are resolved as follows:

1. We will continue to make our concerted efforts in alliance with all the peoples and organizations of the world to bring about justice to the Comfort Women.
2. We will continue to remind the U.S. Government and American public of Japan's evident rejection of U.S. House Resolution 121, and to protest U.S. support for Japan's role in international affairs, including her attempt to become a permanent member of the U.N. Security Council.
3. We will continue to educate and inform Japanese youth of the horrible truth about Comfort Women and the totally twisted and distorted history provided in their textbooks, clearly an effort to obscure Japan's wrong-doing toward the Comfort Women.
